# Horticultural Section Rules

1. The Committee will be on the Showground from 5pm to 7pm on Sunday and 7am to 9.45am on Monday to receive exhibits. **All entries must be staged by 9.30am.**

2. Only bonafide exhibitors will be allowed into the tent prior to judging. **All persons except officials must leave the tent by 10am.**

3. No cards or exhibits may be removed before 3.30pm without the approval of the section secretaries. Any item not removed by 4pm will be deemed to be a donation and will be auctioned on behalf of Society funds.

4. The decision of the judges is final except as provided in Rule 5, the judges may withhold any prize where there is evidence of lack of merit or, where there are fewer than three entries, may award places according to the merit of the entries.

5. If any dispute shall arise, notice must be given to the secretaries on the day of judging with a fee of £2.00. The matter of the dispute will be considered by at least three members of the Committee, whose decision will be final. In the event of the objection being sustained, the fee will be refunded, otherwise it will be forfeited and placed in the Society funds.

6. The Committee will take all care possible, but cannot be held responsible for damage or loss of any exhibit. Exhibitors should generally supply their own containers. However, vases are available for the dahlia, chrysanthemum and gladioli classes.

7. Prize monies will be paid out at 3.30pm.

**8. All exhibits are to be the property of the exhibitor and should have been in their possession for at least 28 days prior to the Show. Any departure will result in disqualification. All horticultural exhibits shall be grown by the exhibitor, with the exception of Class 10 and 14 entries. All handicrafts shall be the work of the exhibitor.**

9. Any exhibitor whose entry fees total more than the cost of adult admission will have their admission refunded on production of their ticket.

**11. All cars must be removed to the main exhibitors' car park by 10.00am in accordance with Health and Safety Regulation**

### **Art Section**

Will exhibitors of framed pictures please attach hooks or similar to their pieces of work, so that they can be hung on the pegboard walls. This allows for more exhibits to be displayed.

### **Photography Classes**

All photography exhibits should be **unframed** and printed or mounted on A4 size paper. Frames can be removed on the day and A4 paper will be provided.

### **Children's Classes**

All children's exhibits should be their own unaided work and their names should not appear on the exhibits.

### **Trophies**

With the exception of the Society Championship Cup, the silver and bronze awards for Dahlias and awards for Children's crafts, it has been decided to discontinue the presentation of trophies. Instead rosettes for "Best in Section" will be awarded.

### **Grand Auction**

There will be an auction outside the Horticultural Tent at 3.30pm when, with the owners' agreement, exhibits of dahlias, chrysanthemums, gladioli, other flowers, cookery items, fruit and vegetables will be sold to the highest bidder.

## **Chocolate Victoria Sponge Cake**

### **For the cake**

225g Unsalted butter or margarine (8 oz)  
225g Caster sugar (8 oz)  
175g Self-raising flour (6 oz) sieved  
50g Fine dark cocoa powder (1.8 oz)  
4 Medium eggs (1.8 oz)

### **For the icing**

75g Unsalted butter (2.6 oz)  
175g Icing sugar (6 oz)  
45g Fine dark cocoa powder (1.6 oz)  
About 20 - 30 ml milk

### **Method**

Pre-heat oven to 180C/350F/Gas Mark 4. Grease and line two 20 cm (8 inc) sandwich tins.

Cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs and if the mixture starts to curdle, add a little flour.

Fold in the remaining flour and the cocoa powder with a metal spoon.

Divide the mixture between the two tins and bake for approx. 25 minutes until golden brown and firm to the touch. Remove from the oven and leave to cool before turning out onto a cooling rack.

To make the butter icing, place the butter in a bowl and beat until soft. Gradually sift and beat in the icing sugar and then add enough milk/water to make the icing fluffy and spreadable. Sift and beat the cocoa powder into the icing and use it to sandwich the two sponges together.

Dust the top of the cake lightly with some sieved icing sugar.
